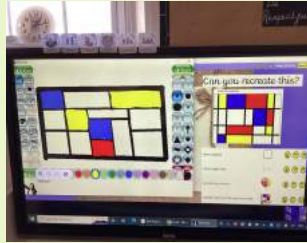


Computing Newsletter

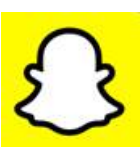
