Take a look at what Geography has looked like during our Autumn Term.

Year 1 have enjoyed learning about the 7 continents of the World and the 5 Oceans. We have enjoyed playing games and learning songs to help us remember the names of the continents and oceans and where they are in the world. We have also loved learning about animals of the world and learning about which continents different animals originate from.



In **Year 5**. we have studied rivers. We have looked at the famous rivers of the world and how they are used by the people who live near them. By looking specifically at the River Tees, we identified different features of each course of the river. We found out about how erosion and deposition cause Ox Bow lakes, waterfall and estuaries.







Our Geography in **Year 4** has linked in with our Vikings topic. We looked at Migration. Thinking about why people migrate to new places. We looked at the positives and negative reasons we might migrate and if this is similar to why the Vikings went in search for new lands.





Year 6 have been learning about population in contrasting countries. We have investigated the population data ourselves and presented them in 'Population Pyramids' which represents populations of men and women of a particular area.

This term we are looking forward to celebrating National Geographic day! This is celebrated on the 27th January. Look out for more Geography themed days throughout the year.
