
Dear Families,


The children in **Year 2** spent the Autumn term looking at how Muslims live.

This half term they are learning about the 'good news' that Christians say Jesus brings.




Year 4 spent the Autumn term learning about what do Hindus believe God is like and also what it means to be a Hindu in Britain today.

This half term they have moved on to learning about Christians and what kind of a world did Jesus want.



Year 6 have learnt why Christians believe that Jesus is the Messiah. This was then followed by the topic about Hindus.

At present they are learning about how do Christians decide how to live and what would Jesus do.




Year 1 children have been learning about stories in the Bible called parables. That means a story with a meaning. They worked together to retell these stories using picture cards.



In the Autumn term **Year 3** learnt about how festivals and family life show what matters to Jews.

This half term they are learning about the creation story.



Year 5 are learning about what does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today? They have spent time looking at the five pillars. As well as some written work there is a lot of discussion that takes place during the lessons, with the children sharing their knowledge and supporting each other with their learning.

During the Autumn term they learnt about Jews and Christians.
