Vision

At **Oxbridge Lane Primary School**, our enrichment offer is underpinned by our vision of ensuring that every child, regardless of background or circumstance, has access to high-quality opportunities that broaden horizons, raise aspirations and enable them to flourish academically, socially and emotionally. - **Behaviour** – Through leadership opportunities, teamwork, sport, outdoor learning and community projects, pupils develop responsibility, resilience, self-regulation and positive relationships, contributing to our calm and respectful school culture.
- **Careers Guidance and Aspirations** – Pupils are introduced to a wide range of careers, employers, higher education opportunities and inspirational role models, helping them develop ambition and understand the possibilities available to them in the future.
- **Curriculum** – Enrichment is carefully mapped to our curriculum, providing meaningful experiences that bring learning to life and build cultural capital. Every year group benefits from visits, visitors and projects that enhance classroom teaching.
- **Personal Development** – Our programme promotes leadership, confidence, independence, citizenship, British Values, diversity, creativity and social responsibility, ensuring pupils leave Oxbridge Lane as well-rounded individuals who are prepared for the next stage of education.
- **Wellbeing** – Physical health, mental wellbeing and positive relationships are prioritised through sport, Forest School, wellbeing initiatives, outdoor learning, creative arts and opportunities for pupils to develop confidence, resilience and self-esteem.

1. A Strategically Aligned Enrichment Offer

Our enrichment programme is fully aligned with the school's vision, values and curriculum. It supports pupils' academic achievement, personal development and wellbeing, while helping to close the disadvantage gap. Enrichment is carefully planned across the academic year to ensure every child has access to meaningful experiences that build cultural capital, confidence, resilience and aspirations.

2. A Broad and Well-Rounded Enrichment Offer

We provide a diverse range of opportunities that extend learning beyond the classroom. These include educational visits, residential experiences, Forest School, sporting competitions, music, drama, arts, leadership roles, STEM activities, careers education, community projects and clubs. Every pupil experiences a rich variety of activities throughout their time at Oxbridge Lane Primary School.

3. A Well-Communicated Enrichment Offer that Celebrates Participation and Achievement

Our enrichment opportunities are shared with families through newsletters, social media, the school website, parent communication platforms and celebration assemblies. We recognise and celebrate participation, effort and achievement through certificates, displays, newsletters, awards and pupil voice, ensuring children feel valued for their involvement and successes.

4. An Enrichment Offer Shaped by the School Community

Our enrichment programme is informed by the voices of pupils, parents, staff, governors and the wider community. Pupil surveys, School Council, Wellbeing Ambassadors, parent feedback and community partnerships help us continually develop opportunities that reflect pupils' interests, local needs and future aspirations.

5. An Accessible and Engaging Enrichment Offer

We are committed to ensuring every child can participate regardless of background, additional needs or financial circumstances. Many activities are provided free of charge or heavily subsidised, with Pupil Premium funding used where appropriate. Activities are inclusive, adaptable and designed so that all pupils can succeed and enjoy taking part.

6. An Enrichment Offer that Works in Partnership

We work closely with a wide range of partners to enhance pupils' experiences. These include Prince Regent Street Trust, local secondary schools, sports partnerships, community organisations, charities, local businesses, cultural organisations and educational providers. These partnerships broaden opportunities and provide real-world experiences that inspire our pupils.

7. An Outcomes-Focused Enrichment Offer

We regularly evaluate the impact of enrichment on pupils' personal development, attendance, wellbeing, confidence, leadership skills, resilience and engagement with learning. Participation is monitored to ensure all groups of pupils benefit equally, and enrichment opportunities are used to raise aspirations and support positive outcomes for every child.

8. A Continually Improving Enrichment Offer

Our enrichment programme is reviewed annually through pupil voice, staff evaluation, parental feedback and participation data. We identify strengths, address gaps in provision and introduce new opportunities in response to emerging needs and interests.
